

Maths

Y1 – In maths we will finish addition and subtraction under 10 and use this to understand inverse and related facts.

E.g $5 + 3 = 8$, $3 + 5 = 8$, $8 - 5 = 3$, $8 - 3 = 5$. We will then start our new topic on 2D and 3D shape.

Y2 – In maths we will add and subtract multiples of 10. We will partition 2 digit numbers in different ways before moving onto looking at 2D and 3D shapes.



D&T

In D&T we will be looking at different mechanisms and then moving on to exploring sliders, pop ups and levers.



Phonics and Reading

Y1 – We will be continuing the extended code:

- Unit 11: One sound, different spellings: /ie/ i, ie, y, i-e, igh (mind, tie, by, five, night)
- Unit 12: One spelling, different sounds: /u/ oo, u, oul, ou, o (cook, pull, could, trouble, son)
- Unit 16: One sound, different spellings: /s/ s, ss, st, c, ce, se (sink, miss, whistle, cell, fence, mouse); One spelling, different sounds: s (/s/ /z/ /sh/) (cliffs, eggs, sure)

Y2 – We will be finishing the extended code units:

- Unit 43: One sound, different spellings: more spellings of /or/ (or, aw, a, ar, au, al, oar, ore, our, augh, ough)
- Unit 44: One sound, different spellings: /h/ (h, wh)
- Unit 45: One sound, different spellings: more spellings of /k/ (c, k, ck, ch, cc, q)
- Unit 46: One sound, different spellings: /r/ (r, rr, rh, wr)
